Prayers of Intercession

We pray for those who cope with their illness, and the illness of those they love. We pray for our residential homes, especially for those in our parishes. We name before you people for whom we are especially concerned. We pray for friends locally, and we pray for the Duke of Edinburgh, for Her Majesty The Queen and their family, may they know your love and strength. Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer**.

We pray for the next few weeks and months. For schools and universities, for our business communities, for shops, pubs, cafes, heritage sites. For the places we value, the people we value, all the challenges of this summer. For our government, our Members of Parliament, for our City and County Councils. For wisdom, justice, vision, and patience. Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer**.

We pray for the life of the church. For our Lenten journey, our friends in Allestree Churches Together, in our Deanery. For our Bishops Libby and Malcolm, for our PCC Standing Committees as we plan for the reopening of our buildings. For our faith, our witness, our journey. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We give thanks that Lent leads to Easter. We pray for those who have died, those we miss so much. Lord, we thank you that you are with all generations, past, present and future. We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
